ICSE and ISC Result 2018 for XII Class has been announced on the official website. This year the performance has improved due to overall revision of the percentage the Council revised the overall percentage required for passing in the exam. 98.51 per cent students have passed in class 10 (ICSE) examination.

Southern region has recorded the highest pass percentage in ICSE with 99.69 pass percentage, followed by Western region with 98.38%. Northern region has 95.97% and Eastern region has 95.85% pass percent. All India topper for ICSE (Class 10) is Swayam Das from St Mary's ICSE School, Navi Mumbai with 99.4% marks.

India emerged as the 2nd largest source of foreign students in USA

India has emerged as the second largest source of foreign students in the US, with over 2 lakh Indians currently studying in various American universities as revealed by a latest official report.

China has topped the list comprising 377,070 students of Exchange Visitor Programme (SEVIS) of the US Immigration and Customs Enforcement's Homeland Security observed by Investigations. 49 % of the Male and Female students population in the United States hailed from either China or India (211,703 students), and interest is reported to continue to grow.

Two different types of non-immigrant student visas in the US: the F-1 and M-1 visas are in vague. The F-1 visa is for those desirous who go for Academic Studies and/or Language Training programme, and the M-1 visa is for those who are planning to go for Non-academic or Vocational studies. Observations reveal that both China and India



show proportional growth between 1 and %: China sending 6,305 students and India 2,356 ones.

At this level, participation from China and India makes Asia far and away the most popular continent of origin with a 77 % of all international students in the US call Asia home as revealed by the recent report.

However, there was steady growth in the number of students between the two countries, the two most populous nations show a slight decrease in the number of Asian students coming to study in the United States. There is a sharp decline in the number of students from Saudi Arabia (-9,971), South



Korea (-5,488), and Yemen (-396) outweighed the rapid growth in the number of students coming from Pakistan (+448), Myanmar (+206) and Cambodia (+109).

The total number of SEVIS records for active Male and Female students was decreased by 0.5 %, from 1,208,039 in March 2017 to 1,201,829 in March 2018. Through a variety of programs overseen by the US State Department, the J-1 visa offers cultural and educational exchange opportunities in the United States.

DU to revise Cut-off Formula

Delhi University is going to revise Cut off Formula and it is a good news for the students of state boards. The admission committee is planning to introduce a new formula of cut-off in Graduate Admission for the upcoming academic session that will bring the candidates from CBSE a loss of 10 % marks in securing the seat in DU for their admission.

The sources say, "The admission committee has passed the proposal to change it and sent it to the Standing Committee of the University. The proposal has been pending due to opposition of some members in the Standing Committee meeting. Before the admission process, the meeting of




the Standing Committee can take place once again. The proposal for admission in the committee may get final approval."

Students of Science Stream from state boards who have secured 60 marks in theory and 40 marks in practical will get a loss of 10 marks when applying to DU. DU generally follows the CBSE evaluation in case state boards do not adopt such criteria as deduction.

Students graduated from state boards of Rajasthan, Haryana, Madhya Pradesh will lose out by a considerable percentage applying for Higher Studies would now benefit under the new system.




The proportion of theory and practical numbers of many state boards is 60:40, while Delhi University evaluates the marks of students of these boards in 70:30 ratio. Students

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Google.org expands grant pool to support Education in India

In an effort to further support Education and learning efforts in India, Google.org, the philanthropic arm of Google, on Thursday announced additional grants of \$3 million to two non-profit organisations -- Central Square Foundation and The Teacher App.

With online video emerging as a popular medium of learning, Google.org will provide a \$2 million grant and technical assistance from the YouTube Learning team to Central Square Foundation -- a policy think tank focused on improving the quality of school education.

The grant will support a minimum of 20 content creators to produce at least 200 hours of quality science, technology, engineering and Math content in Hindi and vernacular languages.

With \$1 million grant to The

Teacher App, Google.org aims to empower teachers with the right training and resources on concepts of Math, science, language and pedagogy. The funds will be used to scale the platform to reach 500,000 teachers in two years.

"We strongly believe that technology can play a powerful part in solving the learning gap in India, and we are expanding our investments in India to ensure that all teachers and students are able to benefit from it," said Nick Cain, Education Lead, Google.org.

With the additional grants, Google.org's total grant for NGOs in India to support learning and education efforts stands at \$11.4 million.

Four NGOs -- Learning Equality, Million Sparks Foundation, Pratham Books StoryWeaver, and

Pratham Education Foundation -- received total grants of \$8.4 million to add scale to their existing efforts and help provide access to quality education and learning for all.

Since receiving Google.org funding last year, the grantees have reached more than 800,000 students and teachers with their tools and programs across India. "These new funds will help contribute in building more locally relevant solutions and content for students and teachers," Cain added.

"Globally, learning and educational content drives over a billion views a day and we believe there is a huge opportunity for creators in India to enhance education and learning through YouTube," said Satya Raghavan, Head of Entertainment for India at YouTube.

India was among the first country to receive grants from Google.org's global \$50 million commitment to support nonprofits who are building tech-based learning solutions.

Class 12 pass percentage has dropped from last year when it was 96.47%.

"We did not follow any moderation policy. Also, there was no spiking of marks. Despite that the number of students scoring above 99 per cent has increased this year," Gerry Arathoon, the CEO of the Council, told.

"Last year also, we had waited for the Delhi High Court order and then for CBSE's stand on the issue as the in-principle decision to scrap moderation policy was taken unanimously by 32 boards," he added.

While 49 students got more than 99 per cent in the Class 12 exam, 15 students scored more than 99 per cent in the Class 10 exam.

The pass percentage obtained in the major subjects in the ICSE Examination:
 English 99.75%; Bengali 99.71%; Hindi 99.91%; History, Civics & Geography 98.77%; Mathematics 95.25%; Science 98.65%; Commercial Studies 99.11%; Economics 96.83%; Physical Education 99.97%; Computer Applications 99.99%; Economic Applications 99.97%; Commercial Applications 99.96%.

The ICSE Examination has been conducted in 61 written subjects of which 22 are Indian languages and 10 are foreign languages. The ISC Examination has been conducted in 48 written subjects of which 14 are Indian languages, 5 are foreign languages and 3 are classical languages.

For ICSE in India, the Southern region has the best pass percentage i.e. 99.69% followed by the Western region (99.67%), Eastern region (98.02%) & Northern re-

gion (97.91%). Abroad, ICSE has achieved 100%.

For ISC in India, the Southern Region has the best pass percentage i.e. 98.38%, followed by Western Region (97.22%), Northern Region (95.97%) and Eastern Region (95.85%). Abroad, ISC has achieved pass percentage of 99.36%.

Students from 2,161 schools attended in the ICSE examinations this year in India and abroad, while, students from 1,034 schools appeared in ISC exam.

The pass percentage obtained in the major subjects in the ISC Examination:
 English 99.44%; Bengali 99.92%; Hindi 99.72%; Economics 85.80%; Commerce 96.09%; Accounts 91.75%; Mathematics 86.41%; Physics 96.83%; Chemistry 98.57%; Biology 98.81%; Computer Science 99.54%.

Cut-off Formula

of state boards like UP Board, Bihar Board, Haryana Board and others usually scored less marks in comparison to their CBSE counterparts. Haryana and Rajasthan boards adopt a 60-40 scheme for theory and practical examinations in Physics and Chemistry. But in CBSE it is a 70-30 division. Hence, a student applying to a science course from these boards lose 10 marks from each subject.

In case the proposal of the admission committee gets the final approval, Pro-rata will not be followed and the marks will not be changed in the ratio of 70:30 to the theory and practical examinations.

Chance to change the Streams for MBBS

In a relief for the students who fail to secure admission to MBBS in the first attempt and settle for some other course, Gujarat Govt. said, "Such students can get into the MBBS course if they get the required score in the 'second trial' of the NEET." The norms have been changed to give a second chance to 'bright students who want to pursue MBBS but fail to do well in their first attempt of the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) as announced by Deputy Chief Minister Nitin Patel.

Several students do not secure admission to the MBBS course in the first attempt for various reasons, such as

a death in the family or illness at the time of NEET. "As a result, such bright students have to settle for other streams,

such as Homoeopathy or Ayurveda," he said. As per the existing rules, such students could not switch over to another branch of medicine once getting admission after the first trial. "We have decided to change this rule," he added.

Several Gujarati-origin parents, settled in foreign countries, send children to India for schooling, Nitin Patel said, "Though they are born in foreign countries, such students



live here with their relatives and even pass their 10th and 12th Board exams here. As per the present rule, such students, having OCI card, need to apply only under the NRI quota of a medical college," he said. "We have decided to change this rule. We will now allow such students to apply in the general quota too, provided they have passed their Board exams in Gujarat and have a domicile certificate," he further added.

No Fee refunded from Educational Institutes: HRD

Higher education institutions are not returning fees in case of withdrawal of student's Admission. According to HRD Ministry official, "As per AICTE and UGC norms, institutions are bound to return fees and original documents of students in case a candidate opts to withdraw the admission. "It has been often noticed that some institutions don't refund fees or deduct an extravagant amount while returning. Such institutions will now face action," the official added.

Action has been taken to prevent professional institu-



tions from exploiting students from 'exercising other options of joining institutions of their choice'.

The Human Resource Development Ministry has instructed the All-India Council for Technical Education and the University Grants Commission to take punitive action against such institutions, including deemed universities too, if they fail to follow these directions. "This could include withdrawal of approval and recognition of erring institutions," the official added.

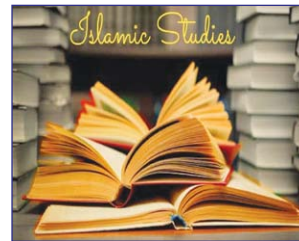

The last date to send the Scholarship applications to the Ministry of Human Resource Development is May 31, 2018 by 5 pm. Students who plan to apply for the 1st level 2nd scholarship should have completed the age of 6-8 years of regular education with distinction marks and should have obtained the preliminary degree equivalent to it.

Along with this, some RJ's also host the Stage-show and Corporate-show. You can also work in music programming, script writing, radio advertising, audio magazine and documentary etc.

Eligibility

There is no specific eligibility for becoming a radio jockey. After completing class twelfth, you can take admission in an institute where professional degree and diploma courses are carried out. There are courses of Certificate or Diploma and Degree-Diploma in Mass Communication for radio jockey. For selection in All India Radio, you must be a graduate. More than the Degree, the way of communication is important. You have to be very skilled in talking to keep people engaged in your show.

Way of income

The starting salary in this

field is 10-15,000. The increment in the salary depends on the experience. The more experience you gain, the more is the salary. A radio jockey can be paid an amount starting from 20-50,000 rupees if he/she has years of experience. Some institutes pay on the basis of a single radio show that is 1200 to 2000 rupees per duty. RJ is a trend at present time.

DU Registration Process set to kick off

The online registration process for admission to Delhi University's undergraduate (UG) courses began today and more than 50,000 seats are up for grabs in the colleges affiliated with central university. A registration link has been activated on the official website of Delhi University, du.ac.in. The online registration process will be done for admission to prestigious colleges including Hindu College, Miranda House College, Lady Sriram College, Shri Ram College of Commerce and Hansraj College among others.

The University said that the registration process of all programmes would be online for all categories.

"The details of the registration process and subsequent procedure will be available in the Bulletin of Information, which will be available online in downloadable form," it



said. Only two colleges, St Stephen's College and Jesus and Mary College, have a separate online admission procedure. Moreover, candidates have the preference to choose various programmes according to their like.

The candidates have to submit the online application before the date of closing of admission procedure, failing which their application could be rejected. According to a DU official, in the current academic year, there will be no separate registration for entrance-based undergraduate

programmes. Candidates are to register through the centralized admission portal for all courses.

"Single-point registration will ensure that all the data is centrally located, and the admission committee has access to it in one place," the official said. The first cut-off list is likely to come out in the first week of June.

The admission portal will help to track the number of seats filled and withdrawals in real time. The application will include both B.A. and B.Com.

More theoretical Revamped MBBS Course

A revamped MBBS syllabus for medical students is to be rolled out by the Ministry of Health that will be more practical than theoretical.

According to a senior official in the Ministry of Health, the revamped syllabus has been finalized in consultation with Medical Council of India that is likely to be rolled out from the next academic session – 2019-20. Teachers are

at training, and it will be completed by the year-end.

In the new curriculum, students will get the clinical exposure right from the first year of the 4.5-year MBBS course as more emphasis has been put on practical knowledge.

"In the new curriculum, there will be chapters on Let's know about in each semester, that will be mandatory for every student to learn and they will have to go through a test after every semester in which their

The syllabus is being changed after a 17-year gap, and all medical colleges in the country will implement it. "The revised syllabus would be based on competency and students would acquire practical knowledge through clinical exposures from the first year," the official added. NEET 2018 Paper Analysis

New Delhi

The NEET 2018 examination just concluded at various centres in 136 cities across the country. Students found this year's paper between moderate to tough. NEET 2018 was slightly easier than last year's papers. Close to 13.2 lakh students appeared for NEET exam today, as compared to the 11.4 lakh last year. According to experts, this dramatic increase in NEET aspirants is primarily due to the increase in the number of states opting for NEET scores over state level Common Entrance Tests (CETs) for admissions in the health sciences. They also say the increase also attributed to an increase in number of students clearing class 12 exams, and various policies and scholarships provided by the government.

"In terms of difficulty level,"

Mr. Rajshekhar Ratrey, VP Educational Content, Toppr.com said: "NEET 2018 was slightly easier than the last year's papers. Most questions were not time consuming. There were similarities between the weightage of marks in this paper, and the 12th standard syllabus".

Chemistry

Coordination chemistry and chemical bonding got a fair amount of representation than expected. Apart from that, there is a balanced representation of 11th and 12th concepts. The questions were of a bit higher difficulty compared to previous years. Except for about five to eight questions, most questions were of moderate difficulty. Electrochemistry and solutions had less than expected representation.

Chemistry was the moderate section amongst the three. This section was not lengthy. There were 20 questions asked from the 12th standard syllabus and

20 questions from the 11th standard syllabus. This section had one difficult question, 20 moderate questions and 24 easy questions. Most questions were based on simple concepts.

In Chemistry, the paper was of standard type with most of the questions were within the scope of NCERT. However, a few questions were beyond NCERT, such as, molecular orbital configuration of heteroatomic molecules, reverse hyperconjugation, etc. All questions were concept based and no memory based question was present. Number of questions covered from class XI and class XII were 25 and 20 respectively. One question from Organic chemistry had more than one correct option. In Inorganic portion, most of the questions were from NCERT. In physical chemistry, numericals were on easier side without

lengthy calculations. In organic portion, multi-conceptual questions were asked keeping it little tricky.

Physics

In Physics, about 10 questions required strong analytical thinking as some of them involved a combination of concepts. The paper covered the entire syllabus comprehensively. There were only a few straightforward questions. The majority were of moderate level difficulty. Unlike previous year's NEET paper, which comprised of questions requiring quick calculation skills and time-consuming problems, this one is more balanced and can be completed within the prescribed time.

Physics was the toughest section amongst the three and it was lengthy, too. There were 24 questions from the 12th standard syllabus and 21 questions from the 11th standard syllabus. This section had two difficult questions, nine moder-

ate questions and 34 easy questions.

Most of the paper was NCERT based. There were both types of questions theoretical as well as numerical. Nearly 80% part of the paper was numerical which is little surprising with respect to Physics. Some questions had long calculations. Number of questions from 11th and 12th part were almost equal 21 and 24 respectively. Some theoretical questions were difficult. As expected majority questions were from rotational motion current electricity, Ray and wave optics.

Biology

Biology had more questions related to human physiology and reproduction, genetics Molecular biology, cell biology, ecology. Rest of the chapters have had a balanced representation. Deviating from the past, questions based on facts and the memorisation of events were more. The difficulty level is moderate and focus on application of knowledge is higher,

which is a good trend.

Biology was the easiest section amongst the three. However, this section was not lengthy. There were 46 questions asked from the 12th standard syllabus and 44 questions from the 11th standard syllabus. This section had 9 difficult questions, 33 moderate questions and 48 easy questions. However, this section was easier than last year and had very few application-based questions. Most of them were directly from NCERT and were concept based. Most students found the paper moderate and expected marks in the range of 350-400.

In Biology, most of the questions were based on the statements given in NCERT but some questions deviated from NCERT. The number of questions from class XI were comparatively more than that of class XII. If the student had read the NCERT well, he/she must have fared well in the NEET exam. The paper was assemblage of easy, average and difficult questions.

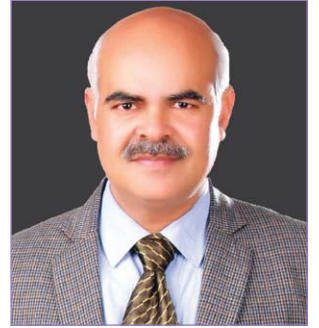
